Welcome to the second Flere Lag Stevne. We are returning to the Red River Valley (of the north) to which many Norwegians immigrated in the late 19th and early 20th Centuries. My own maternal grandparents came to Norman County Minnesota in the 1890s. I remember fondly visiting them in Shelly MN each summer after WWII. My uncle Clarence Gaudland ran a fuel delivery business and when I visited I often rode shotgun in his 300 gal tank truck while delivering gas to local farmers. Most all of his business was conducted in Norwegian. So even 75 years ago I knew my Norwegian heritage.

The Flere Lag Stevne Steering Committee has planned an exciting and meaningful meeting that explores and reveals the depths of the Norwegian-American influence on this part of North America. As the Red River runs from Fargo to Winnipeg, a distance of 221 miles, the elevation changes by 122 feet. That's a bit more than 6 inches per mile. That is flat.

Its European settlement came in a single pioneer generation that included large numbers of Norwegians. Professor Moe has collected thousands of Valley poems (mostly from 1900–1940) that capture clear images of life on this once-remote prairie. But the land was not free, nor was it “empty.” In the early 20th century, those who took advantage of a homesteading opportunity came face-to-face with Spirit Lake Dakota Indians as they settled on their reservation. Access to productive property on the reservation, made possible by the US government, turned Norwegians into the neighbors of Dakotas. Ownership enabled Norwegians—men and women alike—to cultivate land to support their families and make a western home. These same soils, however, can be extremely problematic due to their extraordinary weakness. Covered in this presentation are the post-glacial history of what is today the Fargo-Moorhead region, a brief history of Lake Agassiz, the inception of the Red River of the North, and the challenges/benefits during Euro-American settlement associated with the soils that underlie this region. Why are there so many Norwegians around here? What's the Homestead Act all about? Who are our towns named for? How does a train to nowhere sell tickets? Whether you have family photos, home movies, or a Norwegian Bible, work with an organization that has a variety of collections such as newspapers, documents, spinning wheels and bunads, best practices in the care and preservation of these materials are important. Translator and Viking Reenactor  During June of 2022, I traveled to Norway to participate in the 1,150<sup>th</sup> anniversary jubilee of the Battle of Hafrsfjord in 872. Hafrsfjord is traditionally considered the decisive victory in King Harald Fairhair’s campaign to unify Norway under a single ruler. While there I participated as a Viking reenactor, and also got to visit a number of other historic sites in western Norway. My presentation features photos and highlights of the sites I saw, and I’ll put it all in historical context.</p> 	Salons E + F
	<p><b>Seminar B:</b>  <b>Who the Heck? Identifying Mystery DNA Matches</b>  —Dennis Haarsager, NPR (retired), serving in broadcasting and public media  The Brits use a common phrase, “Bob’s your uncle,” to mean, “and there you have it,” used to express a conclusion that’s somewhat obvious. But what if you’ve had your DNA tested and you’re staring at names on your results pages you don’t recognize, especially those with larger DNA matches. How does this unknown match named Bob Rackafratz fit into what you know about your family? A missing uncle, perhaps? The answer usually isn’t even somewhat obvious.  One of the first things one learns doing genealogy is that facts sometimes conflict with what you’ve heard or even with each other, even for biological parentage. 	<p><b>Seminar B:</b>  <b>Red River Girl</b>—Mark Peihl            Archivist for the Historical and Cultural Society of Clay County, Moorhead, MN            In 2020, the Historical and Cultural Society of Clay County and the West Telemark Museum in Eidsborg, Norway collaborated on a bi-lingual exhibit and book about the art and writings of a remarkable daughter of immigrants from Telemark, Orabel Thortvedt. A trained artist, amateur local historian and talented writer, Orabel wrote a manuscript describing her family's journey from Telemark to the United States in 1861 and their subsequent move to Clay County. When they settled along the Buffalo River northwest of Glyndon, MN in 1870, there were no towns, no schools, no churches or even a railroad. It was the raw edge of the frontier. Orabel's tale is one of great adventure. She kept revising the story for fifty years, never satisfied with it. The two museums published the most complete version of her saga illustrated with her own drawings and paintings and created an accompanying exhibit.</p>	 Salons B + C

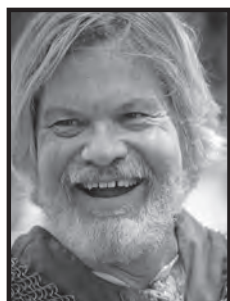

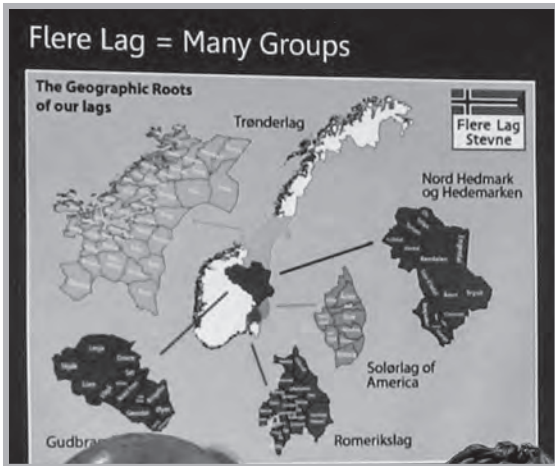
